# CLASSES SCHEDULED TO BE OFFERED

## THREE DAY CLASSES

Friday-Saturday-Sunday

### Class # 101 – EMT Continuing Education- Friday, Saturday and Sunday

This class will be an EMT Recert class so that the EMT can get their 24 hour Kentucky recertification. Training subjects will consist of 8 hours of electives and 16 hours of the Kentucky Core Content requirements for recertification.

***This three-day class will start on Friday afternoon at 1:00pm at MCTC Rowan Campus.***

**Equipment needed: Stethoscope, CPR mask and exam gloves**

**Instructors: Billy Marsh, PHI Flight Paramedic and PHI Aeromedical personnel.**

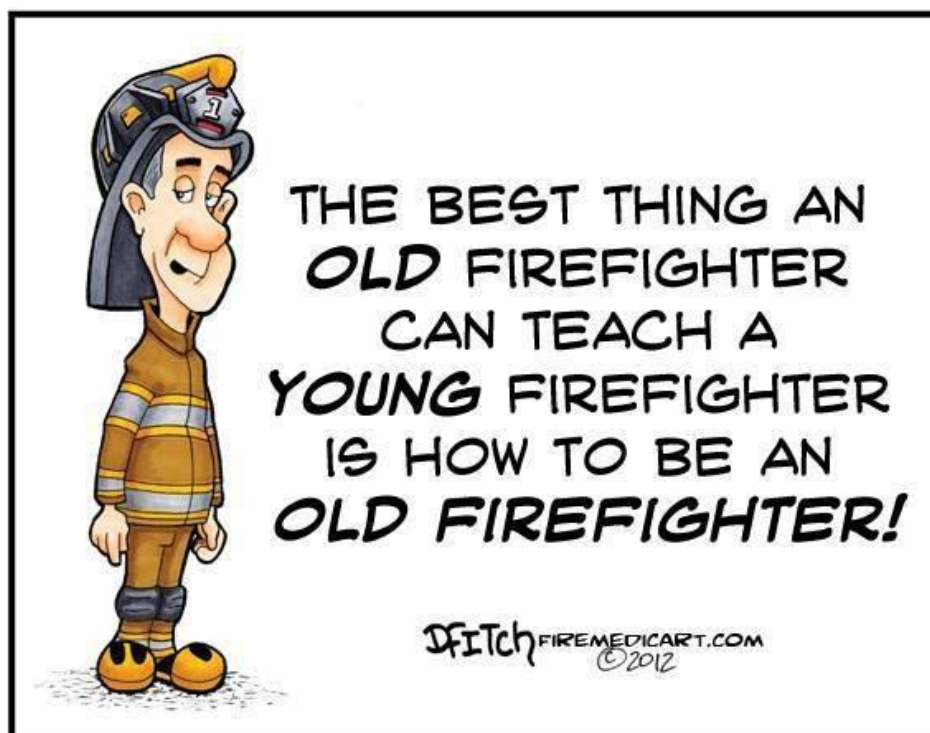
### Class # 102 – Basic Firefighting – Friday, Saturday and Sunday (18-20hrs)

This class will incorporate basic instruction geared toward the “NEW” firefighter in common firefighting activities such as protective equipment, ladders, hose operations, ventilation, initial fire attack and victim search/rescue.

***This three-day class will start on Friday EVENING at 6:00pm at MCTC Rowan Campus.***

**All students will need full turnout gear, SCBA, PASS device, and spare bottle. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant; Students will not be allowed to use gear that is not NFPA compliant, is more than 10 years old, or otherwise possess a hazard to the student. To comply with OSHA standards, students cannot participate with a goatee or beard.**

## **Class # 201 – Hard To Get Hours – Saturday and Sunday (12hrs)**

Have you found yourself needing a few training hours that are next to impossible to find? This newly structured course will suit your needs getting 12 of the hardest fire service training hours to obtain. Students will be able to choose one of two classes offered in the morning and afternoon each day. Three (3) hour classes will be offered and students are required to attend the entire class.

**This two-day class will start on Saturday morning at 8:30am at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

**Saturday morning choose one:** V0000-Building Construction **or** X0000-Emergency Disaster Planning.

**Saturday afternoon choose one:** U0000-Prevention/Public Ed. **or** L0000-Foam Fire Streams

**Sunday morning choose one:** W0000-Aircraft Crash **or** Y0000-Cause and Origin.

**Sunday afternoon choose one:** S0000-Sprinklers **or** N0000-Salvage/Loss Control.

## **Class # 202 – Engine Operations – Saturday and Sunday (approx. 14hrs)**

This class will focus on the everyday activities of the engine crew. Fire attack is the primary responsibility of the engine company and getting the wet stuff and the hot stuff. Handlines and hose lays, initial attack, exposures, GPM's vs. BTU's, crosslays, quik-attacks and more, all incorporated with the state fire commission FireBlast "fire control" trailer. Come ready to work!

**This two-day class will start on Saturday morning at 8:30am at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

**All students will need full turnout gear, SCBA, PASS device, and spare bottle. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant; Students will not be allowed to use gear that is not NFPA compliant, is more than 10 years old, or otherwise possess a hazard to the student. To comply with OSHA standards, students cannot participate with a goatee or beard.**

## **Class # 203 – FARM-Fundamentals of Agricultural Rescue Mechanics – Saturday and Sunday (approx. 14hrs)**

This 2-day course is designed to help the firefighter/rescuer understand responding to farm emergencies. This course is designed to familiarize firefighters with special techniques required to successfully coordinate and execute an agricultural rescue. Topics include:

Rural vs. urban farm accidents • Common types of farm accidents and special challenges • Understanding farm equipment mechanics • Special situations when responding • Management of farm related incidents • Extrication and disentanglement techniques

## **Class #301 – Drone Technology in Emergency Services – Friday Only (Approx 8 Hrs)**

Small, Unmanned Aerial Systems (sUAS, aka Drones) are being used in a variety of public safety applications and many fire departments nationwide are embracing this technology for uses including scene size-up, search and rescue, post-fire salvage, disaster assessment, wildland operations and more. The course will provide an overview of all relevant rules and regulations regarding the use of an sUAS and will explore a variety of emergency service applications for drones. Weather permitting, the course may include a flight demonstration.

**This one-day class will start on Friday afternoon at 1:00pm at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

## **Class #302 – Thermal Imaging Basics – Saturday Only (Approx 7 Hrs)**

This course will focus on utilizing one of the most advanced technologies in the fire services today, the Thermal Imaging Camera. They have become much more economical and compact from those in the first generation of TIC's. The fire service has made great strides in their implementation and availability, but knowledge in their use and functionality is still lacking. We will compare compliant and non-compliant units, how each can “see” and “can’t see”, thermal modes and how temperature is measured on the screen. Class will include hands-on in the classroom and outside using the MaxFire Box burn prop.

**This one-day class will start on Saturday morning at 8:30am at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

**No PPE required.**

## **Class # 303 – FF Survival – Saturday Only (Approx 8 hrs)**

This course will emphasize utilization of hand tools and self-rescue techniques when disoriented or the primary escape route is blocked. **This course is mandatory for ALL new firefighters for certification.**

**This one-day class will start on Saturday morning at 8:30am at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

**FULL TURNOUT GEAR IS REQUIRED. SCBA units will be provided.**

## **Class # 304 – Island Fork Forestry Staff Ride - Saturday Only (Approx 8 hrs)**

This course is centered around the April 1999 fatal wildland fire that claimed the lives of 2 volunteer firefighters. The session will begin with introductions and a review of the incident that fateful day. Following a provided lunch on site, the class will travel to the fire site for additional review of the fire scene, retracing the events of the incident. The class will re-group at the Route 377 fire department to tie everything together and wrap-up this unique learning experience.

**This one-day class will start on Saturday morning at 8:30am at MCTC Rowan Campus**

**All students will need lace up boots, hardhat, leather work gloves, dress for walking in wooded areas, bring rainwear or umbrella if rain is forecast and tick repellent if desired.**

## **Class # 305 - Firefighter Rescue - Sunday Only (Approx 8 hrs)**

This course is designed to teach you how to rescue fellow firefighters from a burning structure. Special techniques are used for the rescue portion of the 2-part series. The completion of FF survival is a prerequisite for this Course. **This course is mandatory for ALL new firefighters for certification.**

**This one-day class will start on Sunday morning at 8:30am at MCTC Rowan Campus**

**FULL TURNOUT GEAR IS REQUIRED. SCBA units will be provided.**

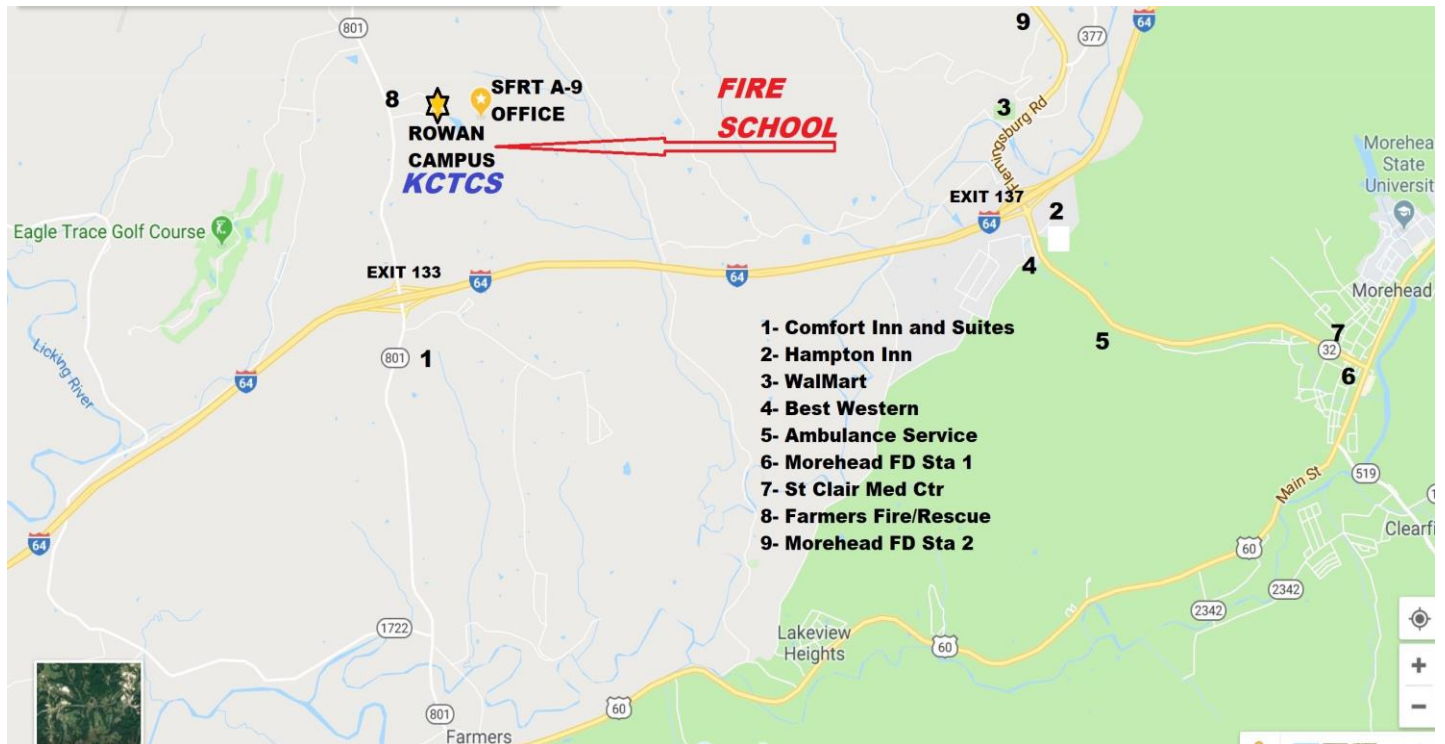


## **Class # 306 – Kentucky Fire Commission Forum - Sunday Only (Approx 7 hrs)**

The Fire Commission is a fast paced ever changing organization. This updated class will bring you the information needed to keep you and your department pointed in the right direction. The Executive Director and staff will update you on legislative changes from the Kentucky General Assembly, newly approved and released changes to the Junior Firefighter Program, Recruitment and Retention efforts, and Health and Wellness initiatives to include Peer Fitness and CPAT mandates that took effect in January 2013. This course will also discuss and answer questions about the programs available through the Fire Commission such as Training Facilities Grants and Low Interest Loans, the Training Records System, and the newly updated and adopted “White Book”.

## **Class # 401 - Kentucky Flashover Awareness - Friday Night Only (3 hr class)**

This course is the Fire Commission mandated flashover awareness training for certification to the 150-hr level. The state Fire Commission adopted this course to help ensure recruit level firefighters are familiar with the dangers of flashover within structure fires, the conditions present leading up to a potential flashover and techniques to prevent or survive an impending flashover. This training is **MANDATORY** for all new 150-hr level firefighters. This is a 3-hour lecture class.

**This short class will be held on Friday EVENING starting at 6:00pm at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

## **Class # 402 - Kentucky Wildland Awareness - Friday Night Only (3 hr class)**

This course is the Fire Commission mandated wildland awareness training (formerly M-0300) with portions of the S-130 (basic Wildland Firefighting) and S-190 (Wildland Fire Behavior) courses being covered, plus a little Kentucky specifics. The state Fire Commission adopted this course for basic wildland firefighting knowledge and is **MANDATORY** for all new firefighters. This is a 3-hour lecture class.

**This short class will be held on Friday EVENING starting at 6:00pm at MCTC Rowan Campus.**

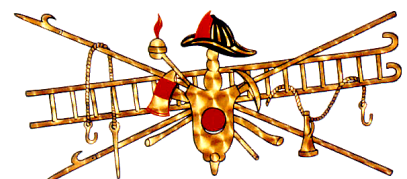
## **Class # 403 – Human Trafficking - Friday Night Only (3-4 hr class)**

This training will give you the knowledge to identify a potential case of human trafficking, whether labor or sex trafficking, and how to respond in a way that can save a life and assist law enforcement in closing down a trafficking ring. Whether responding to a traffic accident, inspecting a business or apartment building, responding to a medical emergency, or just being onsite at a large event, you need to know how to identify victims and respond appropriately. The important role you can play in this fight has been reinforced by the current requirement that EMS receive training on human trafficking identification to maintain certification.

Human trafficking happens in every community in Kentucky every day. Firefighters, EMTs, and Paramedics are uniquely suited to interact with victims of trafficking. You have probably already interacted with a trafficking victim and just didn't know the signs. The office of the Attorney General has multiple criminal investigations that began with tips from firefighters and EMS.

The 2012 edition of NFPA Standard 1403 requires that: "Students participating in live fire training evolution who have received the required minimum training from other than the authority having jurisdiction shall not be permitted to participate in any live fire training evolution without presenting prior written evidence of having successfully completed the prescribed minimum training to the levels specified in 4.1, 5.1, 6.1, 7.1, and 8.1."

NFPA 1403 requires "student prerequisites" to permit participation in live fire training evolutions.
