Firefighter Wisdom

Class listings and descriptions are as follows:

1. ADVANCED VEHICLE EXTRICATION

This extreme sixteen (16) hour class is for the students that have a good working knowledge of extrication tools and techniques. The student will be challenged with a recreated over-ride collision involving two school buses with extreme stabilization issues requiring the use of a heavy wrecker and ladder truck for operations. Students will work with stabilization and extrication from passenger vehicles suspended on guide wires. We will also have many more challenging scenarios. The class will end Sunday with a multiple vehicle highway pile up scenario. This class is MORE TOOLS/TACTICS AND LESS TALK and in each scenario, the instructors will give you a short safety briefing on what you are facing then set up the parameters of the scenario and allow the students to go to work. There will be heavy wreckers on site for use in the class scenarios. ***Safety glasses, NFPA approved gloves, turnout gear or NFPA approved extrication coveralls are required.***

2. EMERGENCY RESCUE SHORING CONCEPTS

This sixteen (16) hour class will cover the concepts and principles of the proper erection of emergency building shoring. The proper size-up, placement and choices of shores will be covered. Engineering and load path concepts will be explained and the fabrication of Class I and II shores will be completed. A scenario concerning proper size-up, placement and mitigation of a specific shoring operation will be conducted. ***Helmet, gloves, eye/ear protection, steel toe boots and long sleeve shirts are required.***
Class size is limited to 20 students.

3. INTRODUCTION TO SPECIAL RESCUE

OPERATIONS

The focus of this class is breaking down to awareness level discussions and classroom participation for Rope Rescue, Trench Rescue, Swiftwater Rescue, and Structural Collapse Rescue. Each of these subjects will have a 4-hour block consisting of lecture and table top exercises. Every fire department will make calls on these types of rescues but really do not understand the dangers involved. After this class, the student will have a better understanding of each of these subjects. Students will learn what to do and not to do that will keep them safe and out of trouble. The emphasis is on developing showing the student what is needed to correctly manage the situation and how they can be a great part of the team to mitigate the situation at hand.

Saturday classes: Rope Rescue; Swiftwater Awareness

Sunday classes: Structural Collapse Rescue; Trench Rescue

Explorers/Junior FF's are permitted to participate in this class.

4. FARM RESCUE

This sixteen (16) hour class is designed to help the firefighter/rescuer understand responding to farm emergencies and to familiarize firefighters with special techniques required to successfully coordinate and execute an agricultural rescue. Topics include: Rural vs. urban farm accidents; common types of farm accidents and special challenges; understanding farm equipment mechanics; special situations when responding; management of farm related incidents; and extrication and disentanglement techniques. ***Turnout gear or coveralls, fire helmet or hard hat, safety glasses, work gloves and steel toe boots are required.***

5. LARGE AREA SEARCH

This is a sixteen (16) hour class designed for all members of your department. This class will go over the basics involved to have a successful search of a large area. Topics that will be covered will be oriented team searches, searching off a hose line, searching using rope, and using thermal imaging in your search. This class will utilize real world scenarios in a realistic setting. We will also review different individual techniques to assist in completing a thorough search over a large area. This will be all hands-on both days. ***Full PPE including SCBA with spare bottle will be required. Class size is limited to 20 students. Explorers/Junior FF's are permitted to participate in this class.***

6. CONFINED SPACE RESCUE

This sixteen (16) hour class is designed to meet the training demands of 29 CFR 1910.146 and NFPA 1670. It will involve intensive classroom and field instruction for each student to ensure proficiency in the basic skills needed to safely and efficiently perform entry rescues. Topics covered in the program include assessment of confined space hazards, atmospheric monitoring, confined space rescue equipment use and limitations, knots, vertical and horizontal hauling, lowering systems, PPE and patient packaging. This is a sixteen (16) hour certificate course only and will not certify the student as a Confined Space Rescue Technician. ***Helmet, gloves, eye protection, steel toe boots, long sleeve shirt and long pants are required. Class size is limited to 25 students. Explorers/Junior FF's are permitted to participate in this class.***

7. MACHINERY EXTRICATION

This sixteen (16) hour class gives students hands-on into machinery entrapments and extrications, simple to complex levels. The first hour is spent in the classroom reviewing tool kits, lock-out/tag-out techniques and procedures, and medical considerations. We will review calls other departments have responded to and discuss techniques and ideas. Following the classroom presentation, students will participate in the following rotations:

- *Tool familiarization*
- *Finger Entrapment*
- *Impalements*
- *Lock-out/Tag-outs*
- *Real Machine Entrapment scenarios*

Turnout gear or coveralls, fire helmet or hard hat, safety glasses, work gloves and steel toe boots are required. Class size is limited to 20 students.

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The cost for this school is \$20.00 per student for the entire weekend. You will not find any of these specialized classes being offered anywhere else in the state at this cost with these knowledgeable Instructors. We urge you to take advantage of these classes and register now! Pre-registration also allows us to anticipate the need for extra instructors/equipment/class materials and to prepare for the best possible learning experience for each student.
